### **Closed albums: Harry Reynolds**



Longtime member Harry Reynolds passed away on October 24. Harry was a former IEPS president and an active member for many years. He specialized in the stamps of China and in weather-related topical stamps. After Harry's wife Shirley passed away, he moved to Shoreline in Western Washington to live with family in October 2004.

Harry was born in Buffalo, New York, and served in the US Air Force as a meteorologist for 22 years. He spent most of his time in the Air Force overseas, and retired from McChord Air Force Base. Afterwards, he was a meteorologist in Spokane from 1973-92. Harry is survived by children Mark, Scott, and Susan; five grandchildren; and eight great-grandchildren.

According to Harry's son Mark, Harry "LOVED his WIFE, STAMPS & SPOKANE," and never much liked living in Western Washington.

Editor's note: I have a lot of good memories of Harry, and first met him as a teenager

when I started attending IEPS meetings. I moved away after college and spent quite a few years living in Mukilteo in Western Washington. It was great to see Harry again when I attended Sno-King Stamp Club meetings. We were both Spokane expatriates and it was nice to visit with someone I'd known from Spokane. I was also president of the Sno-King club (which meets in Everett and Edmonds) for six years, and remember talking him into being our vice president—which I really appreciated. He also helped out often at Sno-King Stamp Club shows, where this photo was taken.
