

Program: Identifying Stamps

What do these two stamps have in common? They are examples of worldwide stamps that can be difficult to identify. At left is a stamp from the

German "Germania" issue, and at right a US Washington-Franklin issue. Varieties of paper, perforations, watermarks, gum, die varieties, etc. can be challenging and require study, and can determine whether a stamp is a common issue or a scarce variety.

Do you have stamps that you have difficulty identifying? Or do you specialize in issues where you are knowledgeable about the varieties of a particular issue and can share that knowledge? For our April meeting, either email a scan of one or two stamps to Bill Ailes (<u>Billailes1@comcast.net</u>) or bring them to the meeting.
