May 11 Weekend in Wallace at the Wallace Inn (100 Front Street, I-90 exit 61)





Opening bid will be \$3.00 or the sellers stated minimum selling price. Bidding increments will be announced by the auctioneer. Minimum price, if any, must be stated on the lot card.
