Many of us will remember him as a Board member, club auctioneer, and for his involvement with John Arn in the Northwest Federation of Stamp Clubs. Howard collected postal history, including a large collection of Spokane, Hawaii, Saint Pierre and Miquelon, and misc. other things. He was an IEPS life member, known for helping other members, and knowledgeable about many philatelic subjects. Howard will be missed by all who knew him.


Chuck Jones

Howard Ness obituary

NESS, Howard B.

Howard Benedict Ness, 88, passed away on March 5, 2024, in Federal Way, Washington, from complications of Alzheimer's Disease. Howard was born on July 28, 1935, in Great Falls, Montana, to Ordway ("Ord") Mess and Marion Benedict. He and his family moved to Billings, where Howard graduated from Billings High School in 1953. Howard attended the University of Montana, graduating with a



Montana, graduating with a degree in business in 1957. In college, Howard was a member of the SAE fraternity and was enrolled in the Army ROTC program. It was in college that he met Beverley Bungarner, whom he married in Great Falls, Montana, on July 13, 1957. After the wedding, the couple moved to ft. Monmouth, New Jersey, where Howard served as a Lieutenant in the Army Signal Corps.

After completing his Army service, Howard and Beverley returned to Montana and later settled in Spokane, Washington. In Spokane, Howard first operated Howard's Photo Center, but subsequently made a career change to Real Estate, first at Rogers & Rogers, then opening America West, and finally at Properties One.

For decades, Howard was an active and respected member of the Spokane business and civic community. He served on the Board of Deaconess Hospital, was a member and past president of the Spokane Board of Realtors, and a member of the Spokane Real Estate Trader's Club. Howard was an active member of Spokane Rotary Club 21, serving as president in 1996-1997. He was also a member of Shriners International, a 33rd degree Mason, and a member of The Westerners.

An avid philatelist who enjoyed collecting stamps and philatelic paper from many parts of the world including Japan, the Philippines, and Hawaii, Howard started collecting stamps at age 6. He was a long-time member of the Inland Empire Philatelic Society, and over the years frequently attended and was an exhibitor at philatelic shows in the Pacific Northwest. Howard was also a lifelong outdoor sportsman who enjoyed fishing and hunting with family and friends.

Howard was preceded in death by his wife, Beverley; who passed in 2018. He is survived by his daughter, Elizabeth Ann Matlick, and son-in-law, David Matlick of Federal Way, Washington; granddaughter, Sarah Matlick; and brother, Donald Ness. There will be a private (immediate family only) interment at Greenwood Memorial Terrace on April 20, 2024. Monetary donations in Howard's name may be directed to the Alzheimer's Association.
