Expo '74 Postal Station

2024 marks the 50th anniversary of the Expo '74 World's Fair in Spokane. Museum exhibits and other events have commemorated the anniversary.

The fairgrounds had a postal station, located in a small 24-by-24-foot wood building (see figure 1) that was part of a "Travel Terrace" strip mall that also included Hughes Airwest Airlines, a currency exchange, and two other offices.

Mail deposited at the Expo '74 postal station was taken to the downtown Spokane post office for processing, and didn't receive a special cancel.




Figure 2: May 4, 1974 Expo '74 rubber-stamped opening day cancel with the stamp issued for the fair. Purple ink was used only on May 4, and black ink was used afterwards.

Figure 2 shows a special rubber-stamped Expo '74 hand cancel that was available to visitors who came in person to the fair postal station and requested their mail be hand canceled. Cancels were in purple ink on the May 4 opening day, and in black for the rest of the fair.

Few of the Expo '74 structures were meant to be permanent. After the fair ended, many were torn down or sold at auction. Mark Conlin bought the post office building for \$250 at an auction in March, 1975. He moved the building to Lake Pend Oreille, near Sagle, Idaho, where he used it in building a lake cabin. The cabin still exists, and was featured in a July 7, 2024 *Spokesman-Review* article. In the article, Conlin told how he came to buy the post office building and how he turned it into a lake cabin.

Figure 1: Map showing the Expo '74 postal station, located on the west side of the grounds.
